HCS Snow Removal Procedures

*The threshold to start cleaning driveways from our contractor is 5 inches, measured after the storm is over and to begin after Berkeley plows the streets (not predicted amount). Berkeley township will begin to plow at 2" (see attached from Berkeley Township website about their snow removal procedures).

* If you don't want your driveway plowed, we have flags that you can pick up at the office, for free and you can put them out along the edge. Other options are: leave your car in the driveway towards the back-end apron and/or put magnetic reflectors on your garage door. Remember, once they start cleaning the driveways you will need to move your cars out of the driveway so that he can plow.

* Contractor stays 2 feet away from the garage door, please don't open the door and ask him to do closer. They do not provide hand shoveling or salting.

* Our contractor is not responsible if Berkeley Township plows you in after your private contractor cleans your driveway.

* Clubhouse property is always cleaned of snow regardless of the amount.

* Please don't call the office until after the storm is done and the contractors have ample time to do the cleanup.

SNOW PLOW AND SALTING PROCEDURES

At the start of a snow storm, salt and sanding vehicles are dispatched in Berkeley Township. Major roadways are usually done first, followed by secondary roadways. After the snow has stopped and it has been determined that accumulations have exceeded 2" to 3", the Township will begin to snowplow.

The Township will utilize approximately 70 pieces of Township equipment and approximately 30 contracted loaders for cul-de-sacs. All streets are opened curb to curb to insure the drains are opened. Sanding and salting operations continue as needed.

Each snowplow vehicle has been assigned a section to plow and will remain in that section until all roadways have been sufficiently cleaned. This may require the snowplow vehicle to make multiple passes on each street. Township forces will be plowing each street from curb to curb during each snowfall. On occasion, due to the lack of areas between the sidewalk and curb, sidewalks and driveway aprons may become covered with snow that falls off the Snowplow blade.

Township forces will not remove snow from any sidewalk or driveway apron in these instances. We regret this unfortunate inconvenience. At no time is snow to be disposed into the street from the property, parking lots, driveways and sidewalks. All snow blowers should be directed to blow snow back onto the property.

After the streets are plowed and salted, snow deposited back into the roadway creates hazardous situations, causes additional plowing of the streets and blocking of parked vehicles and driveways after the original cleanup. Summonses could be issued for non-compliance. We want to thank everyone for complying with these requests and following the ordinances, rules and regulations of the Township of Berkeley.

TREES IN THE COMMUNITY

Recently we have had several severe storms. Many of us have had tree limbs and or trees fall. The rule of thumb regarding these fallen trees and/or tree limbs is simple. If a tree or tree limb(s) that are in the common area fall in the common area, we leave the downed tree and/or tree limbs where they fall, unless they are creating a hazard. If a tree or tree limbs from the common area fall onto a member's property, the association will remove them. If a tree and /or tree limb do damage to a homeowner's home, they will have to file through their homeowner's insurance for damages, but the association will have the tree and/or tree limbs removed. Also, if the downed tree and/or tree limbs from a tree are from one that stood on the homeowner's property or the township right of way, the homeowner has responsibility for any damage they may cause. This should clarify the association policy for downed trees and/or tree limbs. If a homeowner has a tree on their property and would like to have it removed and are not sure if that tree is on their property for sure, please call the Code Committee and have them come check on it before removing anything. Berkeley Township requires that you have a permit to remove trees.



Dear Residents of Berkeley Township, As we welcome the New Year, the Department of Public Works is excited to share some significant accomplishments and updates that enhance our community's quality of life. We are pleased to announce that we have successfully supplied all residents in the senior communities on the West side of town with trash and recycling cans for automated pick-up. This initiative not only improves the aesthetic appeal of our neighborhoods but also ensures greater safety for our employees.

Please be advised we are adjusting the disability list for garbage and recycling pick up. This service is offered to help our disabled residents get their trash and recycling cans to the curb. When approved and added to our list, a sanitation employee collects your garbage and recycling can from in front of your garage, empty its contents, and return it to its original location.....Starting in 2026, in lieu of a doctor's note, residents are now required to provide a copy of their handicap card issued by the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.



This change aims to streamline our processes by, eliminating the need for annual renewals of medical documentation. You will simply renew your information with the Department of Public Works upon the expiration date on the card.


Additionally, we are pleased to announce that our recycling center is now open during lunch hours and accepts bulk items. We encourage all residents to visit the newly improved Berkeley Township website for comprehensive information on our services. We also recommend downloading the free app, Recycle Coach, which offers interactive features including real-time service updates for trash and recycling, as well as guidance on appropriate recycling locations for various items throughout the county and state.

For new construction homes, you may pick up your complimentary trash and recycling cans from the Public Works office by presenting your certificate of occupancy. If you wish to update or acquire a second garbage or recycling can, it is available for a fee of \$65, with a maximum of two cans per household. Bulk scheduling offered at no cost and may be completed through our website. Once a request is placed, a representative will be in contact with you. Please be advised that any bulk exceeding 4'x4'x8' will be classified as a clean-out and is subject to a \$250 fee. Items may not be placed at the curb until your bulk pickup has been scheduled and should not be set out at the curb more than 24 hours before the scheduled collection date.

Our commitment to maintaining the beauty of Berkeley Township extends beyond waste management. The Street and Roads Department focuses on enhancing our infrastructure, while our Parks and Beach Department ensures our recreational spaces remain inviting and well-maintained. Public Works is dedicated to keeping an open line of communication with all residents to best serve our community.

Absolutely **NO** exterior additions, changes, or alterations of any kind can be made until the plans and specifications showing all details are submitted to the Code Committee and approved by the Board.

If plans are within the guidelines of our By-Laws, an approval letter will be prepared and given to the homeowner and submitted to the Zoning Board Officer of Berkeley Township to obtain a permit, if needed.

This pertains to any changes, additions, or alterations on the exterior of the home - roof, siding, paint, driveway, patio, sheds, etc.

Absolutely **NO WORK** can be started without permission from the Homeowners' Association or without a permit. **FINES WILL BE IMPOSED if this is not adhered to.**

GARBAGE NOTICE

Garbage is **NOT** to be put out to the curb **before 4:00 PM on Mondays**. This is a Berkeley Township Ordinance and HCS residents must comply. Violators may be issued a fine for non-conformance by the Township and/or HCS. Trash receptacles must be kept in your garage, behind your home, or in an area out of view from the street. Receptacles must be covered and concealed. If you are away, consider having a friend or neighbor place your garbage cans at the curb and return them to their respective out-of-view locations after trash pickup.

With the outbreak of the **COVID-19 virus**, Berkeley Sanitation Department's rules for putting out trash is as follows: ***The Township has made key changes to trash pickup. All household trash must be bagged and placed in an outdoor trash receptacle. Sanitation employees will not pick up trash that is not bagged.***



Announcement: Only homeowners or renters (with a proxy letter from their landlord) to be present for the business portion of the meeting. All others to leave the auditorium until business is complete.

Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Vacant Trustee Seat: Dec. 4th, the Board held a meeting to fill the seat. After reviewing the resumes **Mike Signorile** was appointed. The votes were 4-2 in favor.

Roll Call Taken: All Trustees in attendance.

Financial: Operation account, \$245,023.51. Reserve account, \$953,127.97. Motion accepted.

Workout Room: Several rooms are being looked into for installation with pricing to be investigated. There will not be free weights as the insurance company will not allow it.

Basketball: In the Spring a portable basketball court will be placed out back.

Volleyball: The Trustees are looking into a volleyball net for the pool.

Coat Drive: Ended on Dec. 16th with 25+ bags of coats to be given out.

Toys for Tots: Had 25 bags of toys collected.

Clubs: To submit their information to **Tom** early for submission into the Southwind.

Mike Signorile: Thanked everyone for allowing him to be the new Trustee.

Woman's Club: Over 200 attendees at the Christmas luncheon. The Dec. meeting was on the 16th at 5PM due to the Christmas holiday with entertainment, food and drinks. The Valentine party will be \$38 per person, with a buffet, wine and entertainment.

Social Club: Will have their New Year's Eve party (some tickets still available), with a full buffet and a great time to be had.

Men's Club: The January murder mystery event is sold out. A plaque was made for **Wayne Scragg** (former Trustee and Men's Club member) as he was instrumental with the benches earned near the pool. The Board gave the Men's Club permission to put a plaque on one of them as a memorial to **Wayne**. It states: *"In memory of **Wayne Scragg**, Trustee, Neighbor and Friend. His efforts made HCS a better community. Forever in our thoughts. 1956 to 2025.*

Board of Trustees: Had a plaque made, stating: *"In grateful recognition of Trustee **Wayne Scragg** for his dedication, inspiration and leadership. His impact on the organization and community will be felt for years to come. Gone but never forgotten. Dedicated this December 6th, 2025. Holiday City South Board of Trustees."* It will most likely be mounted with the other awards.

Underage Neighbors: A resident was concerned because of seeing younger people with strollers walking our neighborhoods and questioning that these people are living here. A Trustee noted that if is brought to their attention, it will be addressed.

Unkempt Homes: A resident questioned the homes with their exterior properties in disarray and why these people do not clean up their homes. This resident (along with another resident) volunteered to assist elderly people with their yards. A Trustee explained that the Boys Club previously helped and this would be looked into along with possibly a volunteer group.

Transparent Trustees: A resident stated that people want to know what the Trustees will do for them in 2026; be more open and let opinions be voiced. This resident also has a lot of respect for the Trustees.

New Trustee: A resident congratulated **Mr. Signorile** on his Trustee appointment and feels he is invaluable with his budget knowledge.

Facebook sites: A resident questioned HCS forum (unofficial website) where their post disappeared after their comment regarding the bylaws. This resident feels the site picks and chooses what responses or what posts will be taken down. The Administrator of that site stated they never deleted the post. Another resident claimed their post was deleted from the same site while an additional resident was concerned this site is causing a lot of tension between neighbors.

Christmas Decorations: M. Drenzo will be looking at homes decorated for Christmas and will be giving out gifts.

New Trustee Appointment: A resident questioned why there was no announcement or a request for resumes and interviews and what the procedure is for this going forward. A Trustee stated that in the rules and regulations the remaining trustees will appoint an association member until the next scheduled election.

Bylaws: A resident questioned why there haven't been any bylaw changes with some items being antiquated. The bylaws are registered with the County Clerk's Office with the stamp on the front of the original when they registered. A Trustee stated the bylaws were changed in 2023 and they are open to suggestions for any changes.

HCS Website: A Trustee plans on having our website updated in the future with Code, HOPA and other forms viewable on it.

Voting: A resident was concerned that many of our residents do not come and vote but do go to homeowner meetings and complain.

House Colors: A resident questioned when homes were accepted to be different than the old "parkway" colors. A Trustee informed the residents that 5 additional pages of color had been approved by Code.

Tree Removal: A resident feels trees were removed in her neighborhood that should not have been taken down. A Trustee suggested they get in touch with the office with their concern.

The meeting was officially closed.

Ingredients:

1/4 c. butter	1/2 c. finely chopped onion
2 teaspoons kosher salt	1 teaspoon ground black pepper
1/4 teaspoon garlic powder	1 1/2 c. heavy cream
3/4 c. milk	1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
2 1/2 c. grated white Cheddar cheese, divided	1 tablespoon chopped chives
1 c. Parmesan cheese, divided	
32 oz. frozen hashbrowns, partially thawed	

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Lightly grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.

Heat butter in a saucepan over medium-high heat until melted. Add onions and cook until beginning to soften, about 2 minutes. Stir in salt, pepper, and garlic powder. Add heavy cream and milk and bring to a simmer, stirring occasionally. Stir in nutmeg. Add 1 3/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese and 1/2 cup parmesan; stir until just melted and remove from heat.

Place potatoes in a large bowl, pour in cheese sauce and stir until coated. Pour mixture into the prepared baking dish. Sprinkle casserole evenly with remaining cheddar and parmesan cheese.

Bake in the preheated oven until thickened, bubbly, and browned around the edges, about 40 minutes. Turn the oven's broiler on and place a rack in the upper third of the oven.

Broil until top is browned and bubbly, 1 to 2 minutes. Let stand for 10 minutes; garnish with chives before serving.


